

KASHWAKAMAK LAKE

LOCATION:

Kashwakamak Lake is located in the Township of North Frontenac, north of Highway # 7 and east of Highway # 41.

SIZE / DEPTH:

Perimeter - 65.5 kilometres.	Surface area - 2866 acres.
Length - 15.1 kilometres.	Maximum Depth - 22 metres.
Width - 0.8 kilometres.	Mean Depth - 8.4 metres

QUALITY:

The quality of Kashwakamak Lake is very good. Chlorophyll a concentrations, the green pigment found in algae has increased since 1974 from 2.0 micrograms per litre to 3.0 in 1993. Chlorophyll a levels average 1.8 micrograms per litre indicating increasing nutrients and algae levels with a moderate decline in water clarity. Kashwakamak Lake remains a moderately enriched or a mesotrophic lake, conditions suitable for a variety of recreational water-based activities.
